Join us as we travel to the Wisconsin Dells area for a day of fun and enjoyment.

- 1. Upper Dells Boat Tour, Wisconsin Dells.** Rich in history, this boat Tour features two scenic shore landings: a) Stand Rock, the “trademark of the Dells,” & b) Witches Gulch, a glen with mysterious passageways & also home to swallows’ nests, beautiful trees, ferns & towering rock formations. At Stand Rock, you can watch a specially trained dog leap the five-foot chasm from the main cliff to the rock ledge. c) Guides also relay ancient tales of Native American spirits & legends & true stories about some of the tribal members who made the Dells their home for centuries & describe the Dells’ prehistoric past & how sand from an ancient inland sea was formed into huge rocky cliffs then cut & shaped by a melting glacier. You will also hear historical accounts of the lumber raftsmen of the early to mid-1800s & how they survived the treacherous waters of the Wisconsin River in the Dells region.
- 2. Lunch on your own at River Walk Pub (near boat landing).**
- 3. Wisconsin Dells Craft and Antique Mall & Winery.** For our shoppers, after lunch, we will make a brief stop at these malls before our next event. If you are not a shopper, you might want to enjoy the winery.
- 4. Mid-Continent Railway Museum.** Join us as we take a 7-mile, 55-minute round-trip train ride on a former branch line of the Chicago & North Western Railway nestled in a valley between the Baraboo Hills in rural Sauk County. Passengers ride in restored steel coaches built a century ago. An authentically attired conductor will call “all aboard!” before the train leaves from a historic wooden depot, built in 1894. Mid-Continent is much more than just a train ride. Also explore the indoor/outdoor museum filled with award-winning restorations and railroad exhibits. In all, there are over 40 train cars and locomotives on display and more under restoration.

Sign up in the office and pay that day. **No sales over the phone for any trips.** Meet at the Trinity Lutheran Church parking lot. Departure will be at 7:15 a.m. **Park in the last row.** We will stop on the way home for a coffee/restroom break on your own and will return by 6 p.m. **JOIN US!!!** If we fill the bus, someone will win a **FREE** trip for this day.
